Dear Parent/Carer,

Again, thank you to all of you for your support in the difficult decision we made to close earlier in the week. The school has been fully deep cleaned and crews worked overnight for 36 hours in order to ensure school was open again on Monday. Your concerns for the staff member have been passed on and gratefully received. Your responses have been humbling and very much appreciated by all. We are happy that you all feel we have put the safety and needs of your children first and foremost.

I wanted to reassure you of our preparations in school during the current coronavirus pandemic. As a MAT, we have completed a risk assessment to deal with an outbreak in our school communities. Staff have also shared a video on effective hand washing with pupils and are giving constant reminders to pupils to wash their hands. The current advice from the government in the 'delay phase' is for 'anyone with a "new, continuous" cough or high temperature to self-isolate for seven days'. Staff are already working on producing work packs for pupils and staff if schools are required to close for an extended period.

What an amazing week we have had in school this week. Science week has taken place across the school and the children have been using scientific enquiry when carrying out investigations this week. On Thursday 19th March we are holding 'Odd Sock Day' to raise awareness for Down Syndrome. Unfortunately, we missed our 'Wear Your Wellies to School Day' but we do have 'New Life Day' on Friday 20th March which will provide your children with the opportunity to do some planting outdoors if they bring a plant/shrub into school with them ...and if needed their wellies!

We are also holding our PTFA Mother's Day Sale on 20th March, details are on a separate letter on the school Facebook page.

Adventurers - Science week in Little Dragons. Making volcanos is always a favourite! We have been using scientific language and the children have come up with some fantastic hypothesis' of their own.
